



Supports projects that help Singapore companies transform and upgrade through developing core capabilities, pursuing innovation and productivity, and gaining market access.



Assets by IPOS International

Managing IP Disputes through Alternate Dispute Resolution



Enhanced Mediation Promotion Scheme (EMPS)

Funding for mediation undertaken by parties in dispute before IPOS, regardless of the mediation outcome


Up to \$10,000 per mediation case for:

- ✓ Mediation service provider's fees
- ✓ Mediator's fees
- Mediation-related lawyer / agent fees and disbursements (up to 50%)

Up to \$12,000 per mediation case if the mediation also covers foreign intellectual property rights



Different agencies such as the Intellectual Property Office of Singapore, the Singapore Customs and the Intellectual Property Rights Branch of the Singapore Police Force cooperate closely to create a comprehensive IP rights creation, protection, exploitation and enforcement framework in Singapore.


