

COPYRIGHT SYSTEM

In Malaysia, copyright legislation involves the relevant authorities responsible for the legal framework including the latest amendments to the law, domestic enforcement and international obligations that bind Malaysia in protecting copyright.

THE AUTHORITIES

The legal system of Malaysia was modeled after the English legal system which practices parliamentary democracy and is ruled by a Constitutional Monarchy.

 Responsible to enforce the copyright law under the criminal offences.








ICT USE BY INDIVIDUALS 2021

The Amendments

Copyright Act: Introduce the Marrakesh Treaty provision for exception and limitation, improving the Copyright Register system, improving the establishment of CMO and introducing illicit streaming and criminalize for link sharing of copyright infringement.

Malaysia Copyright Law Amendment (2022) Regulation on Copyright Register system: improving the procedure by making the procedure more straightforward and fast.

Regulation on CMO: enhance the requirement to remained as a CMO by adopting the WIPO Transparency, Accountability and Good Governance in protecting the interest of copyright owner and performer.

Order on Authorized Entity: a legal list of authorized entity in Malaysia which can invoke the exception under the Copyright Law pursuant to Marrakesh Treaty.

THE OUTCOMES

The 2022 amendment to the Malaysian Copyright Law has had a great impact on the awareness of copyright among the Malaysian community, especially for the creators and the owners of the copyrighted works.

The Marrakesh Treaty



Introduce the Marrakesh Treaty provision for exception and limitation...

- Prior 2022: Malaysia Copyright Law acknowledge the exception and limitation for those who are visually and hearing impaired.
- With the obligation under the Regional Comprehensive Economic Partnership, the Copyright Law had been amended pursuant to the Marrakesh Treaty which the process from format shifting and distribution need to be regulate in more systematic way.
- Only the Minister base on the advice of other Ministry will determine and acknowledge whether the application to be authorized entity in Malaysia been acceptable or not by Order from the Ministry of Domestic Trade and Costs of Living.
- Till to date the official Authorise Entities in Malaysia are Malaysian Association for the Blind and National Library of Malaysia.

The Copyright Register



...improving the Copyright Register system..

- Prior 2022: The Copyright Voluntary Notification (CVN) system is a non mandatory notification of copyright ownership which are prima facie evidence in the Court. It had been introduce since 2012. Because of non-mandatory requirement, the Copyright Register only contain the information which have been notified to the Controller of Copyright.
- The important CVN has been sees during the pandemic where there is a lot of complaint on copyright infringement in the online platform which the copyright owner who not using the CVN need to filed an affidavit with sworn statement in order for the enforcement to enforce the copyright law on behalf of the copyright owner.
- Now the important of CVN had become a priority for the copyright owner in enforcing their right via Copyright Enforcement. (see: Illustration 1 & 2)

The Copyright Register Illustration 1

Without Copyright Voluntary Notification

Applicant lodge complaint to Enforcement Officer (EO) EO take action or join action with the Malaysian Communications and Multimedia Commission for online infringement (3 days)

The premises / online platform may be not available because of lengthy time to take action.

 Applicant need to prepare the document (sworn statement) and submitted to the EO (2 working days)

With Copyright Voluntary Notification

Applicant lodge complaint to Enforcement Officer (EO) EO take action or join action with the Malaysian Communications and Multimedia Commission for online infringement (on the same date)

 Applicant inform the EO the copyright information as in per Copyright Register (can be access 24 hours)



The Copyright Management Organization



...improving the establishment of CMO by adopting the WIPO Transparency, Accountability and Good Governance in protecting the interest of copyright owner and performer.

- Prior 2022, the CMO (previously known as "Licensing Body") have been declare by the Copyright Controller without the duration of declaration which cause mismanagement especially in term of audited documentation.
- In order to ensure that the CMO are in the best practices, the law have been amended by improvising the need to renew the declaration and the documentation as base on the current audit practice which standardizes the documentation of all CMO.
- Furthermore, the compulsory to follow the Guidelines under the new law, allowed the Copyright Controller to ensure that the CMO are following the current international practice.

The Illicit Streaming



...introducing illicit streaming and criminalize for link sharing of copyright infringement.

- Prior 2022, the difficulty in taking criminal action in online platform had cause the losses among the copyright owner due to the lack of interpretation in copyright law to suit the need for online infringement situation
- The current amendment had introduce the Illicit streaming as part of an offence either with direct infringement or indirect infringement (share link).
- The amendment also support the usage of the EyeRIS system (Copyright Register)
 or the Cyber Copyright Enforcement Programme (CyCORE) which only cover on
 the film.



The Illicit Streaming X CyCORE



THE Domestic Trade and Cost Of Living has set up the *Cyber Copyright Enforcement Programme (CyCORE)* to battle digital film copyright infringement or piracy of digital films on the internet.



Using the *site-blocking method and content removal* which is the fastest and most effective way of disabling digital film piracy distribution activities with the cooperation of strategic partners without involving the judiciary.



It involves 50 strategic partners including government agencies, e-commerce platforms, and Internet Service Providers (ISPs) in one platform for preventing online digital *film piracy*.

THE AWARENESS


There are many initiatives that have been made to increase understanding of the importance of copyright notification and respect the rights of IP owners by paying royalties and understanding the role of the CMO. It is also important in the fight against copyright infringement by reporting to law enforcement especially online copyright infringement.



MyIPO has organised numbers of initiatives in order to increase awareness among IP Owners, SME entrepreneurs and public at large in order to gain support for filing the intellectual property applications to increase the number of local IP applications.

CHALLENGES AND DIFFICULTIES IN THE FIELD OF COPYRIGHT

like most intellectual property offices around the world, MyIPO also has its own problems and challenges that have to be faced in providing the best service regarding intellectual property, especially copyright to intellectual property owners and creators.

- Unsettling issues related to the collection and distribution of royalties among CMOs to artists fair distributions are much needed;
- Online Filing Application Submission of original documents, multiple filings, uploading of big files and handling of mailed documents manually since 18 March 2022;
- Empowerment of Copyright Tribunal to educate and promote the Copyright Tribunal among copyright owners and creators/artists to file complaints in the tribunal if there is a violation of rights and unfair distribution;
- The emergence of new copyright topics such as Artificial Intelligence Emerging challenges and issues raised by industry players regarding AI and new technologies;

Technical assistance, support, coaching and specialized skills needed to help the organization staying ahead of emerging trends
