### legal framework



Regulation (EU) No 608/2013 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 12 June 2013 concerning customs enforcement of intellectual property rights

Commission Implementing Regulation (EU) No 1352/2013 of 4 December 2013 establishing the forms provided for in Regulation (EU) No 608/2013

Commission Implementing Regulation (EU) **2024/2399** of 12 September 2024 amending Implementing Regulation (EU) No 1352/2013

### scope of the Regulation 608/2013

Regulation 608/2013 is applicable where goods are, or should have been, subject to customs supervision or customs control:

- when declared for release for free circulation, export or re-export
- when entering or leaving the customs territory of the Union
- when placed under a suspensive procedure or in a free zone or free warehouse

Regulation 608/2013 is applicable to all valid IPR in the EU



### exceptions

#### Regulation 608/2013 is not applicable:

- goods that have been released for free circulation under the end-use regime
- non-commercial goods contained in travellers' personal luggage
- goods that have been manufactured with the consent of the right-holder (parallel trade and overruns)



#### customs service role

#### Interceding role – not arbitrary:

- to suspect but not to establish the infringement
- goods under the customs control until the procedure is over

#### Procedure enables the rights-holder to:

- inspect the goods and take samples
- confirm if the goods infringe his IP rights
- request the destruction of the goods
- initiate the court proceeding



### suspicion based on 2 questions

- 1. Are the goods related to any valid IPR?
  - marked with the mark identical or similar to a registered TM?
  - is the geographical indication used?
  - produced based on the (un)registered design?
  - produced related to the copyright or related right?
  - produced based on the patent?
  - related to the denomination of a plant variety?
  - contains registered topography of semiconductors?
- 2. (If yes) Are the goods produced by the rights-holder or with his consent?

### before initiation of the procedure

- physical control of the goods
- taking the samples
- taking the photos
- identification of the IPR concerned
- identification of the rights-holder
- decision on the type of the procedure

### **Application for Action (AFA)**

#### **UAFA**

#### **Union Application for Action**

- covering 2 or more EU MS
- covering IP rights valid throughout the EU
- full data set
- based on the initiative of the Applicant

#### **NAFA**

#### **National Application for Action**

- covering 1 EU MS (where submitted)
- covering any IP rights valid in the issuing EU MS
- full data set
- based on the initiative of the Applicant or ex officio case

**NAFA** cf. Art. 5(3)

#### National Application for Action cf. Art 5(3)

- covering 1 EU MS (where issued)
- covering any IP rights valid in the issuing EU MS
- reduced data set
- based on the *ex officio* case (Customs initiative)

### types of the procedure

- 1. standard procedure
  - based on Application for Action (AFA)
- 2. procedure for perishable goods
  - deteriorate in 20 days
- 3. small-consignment procedure
  - option in the AFA
- 4. ex-officio
  - no valid AFA exists



### standard procedure

- notification to both parties
- 10 working days
- photos, inspection and/or analysis of the goods (RH)
- confirmation of the infringement (RH)
- agreement or deemed agreement of the declarant, owner or holder of the goods
- initiation of the court proceeding
- extension (additional 10 working days)



### small consignment procedure (i)

- conditions
  - consignment in postal or courier traffic
  - maximum 3 articles or maximum 2 kilograms
- suspected infringement of the trade-mark, design, copyright or geographical indications
- based on AFA
- not possible for perishable goods



### small consignment procedure (ii)

- notification only to the declarant, owner or holder of the goods
- agreement or deemed agreement destruction
- no agreement notification to the holder of the decision
- 10 working days to negotiate with the declarant or to initiate the court proceeding



### ex-officio procedure

- notification to both parties
- 4 working days to submit NAFA (RH)
- if NAFA submitted and granted standard procedure
- not possible for perishable goods



### result of the procedure

- release of the goods
  - original / not infringing
  - no reaction of the rights-holder
  - after the court proceeding (no infringement)
- destruction of the goods
  - rights-holder confirms the infringement
  - agreement / deemed agreement of the declarant
  - after the court proceeding (infringement)

anti-COunterfeit and anti-Piracy Information System
European Commission, Taxation and Customs Union

anti-Counterfeiting and anti-Piracy Information System

- mandatory for all EU Member States
- S2S or light-client user interface
- AFA management
- infringement management
- statistics



#### **CRMS**

#### Common Customs Risk Management System

- exchange of risk information
- Risk Information Form (RIF)
- immediately available to customs risk management units in all EU Member States
- implementation of the risk profiles in the national risk management systems
- linked with the national customs clearance systems



### **IP Enforcement Portal (EUIPO)**


#### IP ENFORCEMENT portal

- rights-holders
  - can create, manage and access only their area
     (company information and contacts, IPR portfolio, products)
  - alerts to enforcement authorities
  - digital channel for submitting AFAs
- enforcement authorities
  - can see all rights-holders information
  - notification to rights-holders (Potential Infringement or Trend)
  - notification to other enforcement authorities (Interesting Case)




