

Recent Efforts: ID



Digitization

- In September 2023, IPOPHL started a digitization project covering
 10,333 industrial design (ID) applications.
- This included uploading representative drawings to the system and retrieving physical file wrappers offsite for scanning in cases where no digital copies were available.
- The project was completed in July 2024.

Digital Certificate

- BOP Memorandum Circular 2022-001
- Patent eCerts are issued for all invention applications recommended for grant and UM and ID applications recommended for registrations starting March 1, 2022.
- The eCerts contain **electronic signature** and a unique **QR code** for verification and are sent to the Applicant via eCorrespondence (eCorr) system.



IPOPHL MEMORANDUM CIRCULAR NO. 2022- 0 1 6

Subject:

REVISED IMPLEMENTING RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR PATENTS, UTILITY MODELS AND INDUSTRIAL DESIGNS OF 2022

WHEREAS, it is the policy of the Intellectual Property Office of the Philippines (IPOPHIL) to streamline administrative procedures in the prosecution and registration of patents, utility models, and industrial designs;

WHEREAS, in order to streamline the administrative procedures in the prosecution and registration of patents, utility models, and industrial designs and make them responsive to the requirements of the IPOPHIL and its clients, there is a need to amend certain provisions of the Revised Implementing Rules And Regulations For Patents, Utility Models And Industrial Designs of 2011;

Changes in ID:

- Deferment of Publication
- → 12 months from filing or priority date (1st request)
- → May be deferred for another 12 months (2nd request)
- → Maximum allowed: 24 months (No 3rd request for deferment may be allowed.)
- Filing Date Requirements

EXAMINATION GUIDELINES ON PATENTS, UM, ID INVOLVING GRTKTCE AND IKSP


The objective of this internal document is to guide Examiners on how to handle and treat applications with involve biodiversity, genetic resource (GR), traditional knowledge (TK), traditional cultural expressions (TCE), and indigenous knowledge, systems and practices (IKSP).

To facilitate the disclosure requirements, the IPOPHL revised its application forms to ensure that the source of origin or inspiration of an IP application is disclosed as well as accompanied by a statement of compliance to the FPIC of the concerned indigenous cultural community.

The disclosed GRTKTCE will then be forwarded to the NCIP for their appropriate clearance and verification.

FREE and PRIOR INFORMED CONSENT Requirement





IPOPHL-


An intellectual property right application filed in the IPOPHL shall disclose
any IKSP that is used in the subject matter of the application including
the source or geographical origin of the IKSP used in the application. The
intellectual property right application shall contain the disclosure of IKSP
including a statement of compliance to the requirement of free and prior
informed consent of the indigenous cultural communities concerned.



Artificial Intelligence Guidelines

The Al Guidelines was completed last September 2025 and submitted to the Office of the Director General.

On ID, the guidelines addressed the issue on Artificial Intelligence as an Applicant and Designer.
